CROSSING STREETS SAFELY

The Rules

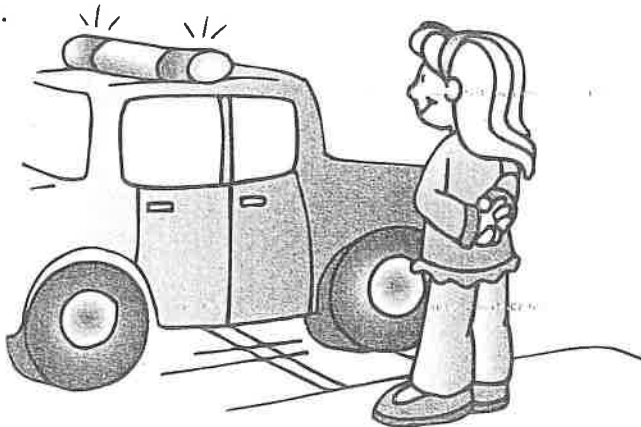
Never run into the street. Cross only at the corner or at marked crosswalks.



Stop at the curb. Look left. Look right. Look left again.

Watch for turning cars, buses, motorcycles, and trucks. Listen for cars coming that you might not be able to see.

Listen for sirens. Never try to cross the street when an emergency vehicle is coming with sirens on, even if the walk sign is lit and the light is green.



Don't dawdle. Cross quickly, but don't run.

The Reasons

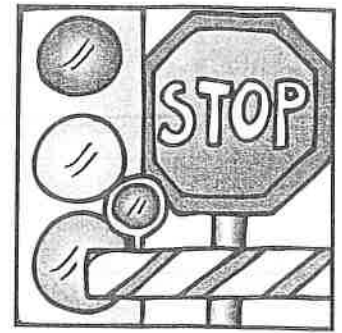
A car may not be able to stop in time if the driver doesn't see you coming.

By looking both ways, you will know if a car is coming from either direction.

If you hear a car coming fast, wait for it, even if you can't see it. Someone driving fast will not be able to stop quickly.

When fire trucks, ambulances, and police cars have their sirens on, that means they are in a hurry. They always have the right of way.

You might slip or trip and fall if you run.
