Get Help if a Poisoning Happens




1 Call the Poison Center Help number if someone eats, breathes, or touches poison, or gets it in the eyes: 1-800-222-1222.

Don't be afraid to call. Only the people who help you will know your name.



3 Experts at the Poison Center know all about poisons. Call if you have a question.







5 Put the Poison Center Help number close to your phone.

Poison Center experts can find someone who speaks your language.





7 Call 9-1-1 if someone won't wake up, is having trouble breathing, or is having seizures.
