1 A poison can make you sick or kill you.

Poisons can be inside and outside your home.

3 Look for these words: **caution, warning, danger, poison, keep out of reach of children.**

Don't eat, breathe, or touch poison.
Don't get it in your eyes.

5 Follow directions when you take medicine.

Keep all products in their original containers.

7 Don't mix cleaning products.

Carbon monoxide (CO) is a deadly gas that you cannot see or smell.

9 Put a CO alarm in your home.

Get Help if a Poisoning Happens



- 1 Call the Poison Center Help number if someone eats, breathes, or touches poison, or gets it in the eyes: 1-800-222-1222.

Don't be afraid to call. Only the people who help you will know your name.



- 3 Experts at the Poison Center know all about poisons. Call if you have a question.

Your call is free anytime during the day or night.



- 5 Put the Poison Center Help number close to your phone.

Poison Center experts can find someone who speaks your language.



- 7 Call 9-1-1 if someone won't wake up, is having trouble breathing, or is having seizures.
